

Immigration Status For a two-semester program (up to 12 months)

Student visa is not required before leaving your country. Students from USA, Canada and Australia need to pay a reciprocity fee before entering to Argentina.

Once you arrive to Argentina you must apply for a non Mercosur Transitional Residence within 30 days from your registration at Universidad de Belgrano. The OFICINA ADMINISTRATIVA PARA ESTUDIANTES INTERNACIONALES (OAPEI) will provide specific help and fast-tracks regarding all these procedures. **Our staff will assist the international students during the process to obtain this document.**

NON MERCOSUR TRANSITIONAL RESIDENCE (STUDENT VISA)

Step-by-step guide to getting your student visa.

1º) Once you arrive to Argentina you must obtain a Certificate of Argentine Criminal

Records: Issued by the Registro Nacional de Reincidencia: Tucumán 1353, Buenos Aires). Advanced appointment request: <http://www.dnrec.jus.gov.ar/>

You will need:

- Your passport
- A copy of the front page of your passport
- Money to pay the tax

2º) You have to ask for your "Constancia de Inscripción" at the OAPEI (UB tower. Floor 17, Office 10)

3º) You must apply for your Transitional Residence at the Dirección Nacional de Migraciones (Av. Antártida Argentina 1355, Buenos Aires). Advanced appointment request: www.migraciones.gov.ar/

You will need:

- Your passport (original)
- A full set of copies of your passport including blank pages
- One 4cm x 4cm color photo, white background
- Constancia de Inscripción issued by Universidad de Belgrano
- Certificate of Argentine Criminal Records
- Certificate of lack of criminal records: issued by the competent authorities of the countries where you have resided for a period exceeding ONE (1) year, during the course of the last THREE (3) years. This document must be legalized by an Argentinean Consular Office in your country or must have the The Hague Convention's Apostille. Since the date of the document you have three months to enter in Argentina. If this document is not in Spanish, you will have to translate it by an Argentinean public translator once you arrive to Argentina, and certify it by Public Translator's Office.
- Money to pay the settling tax
